Senate Report

Sen. Cindy Rosenwald

- Dental benefit started April 1
- Many people losing medicaid eligibility state trying to reach out to people for reconfirmation of status
- Senate pushing to continue Medicaid expansion
- House sent Senate a reasonable budget
- Senate may cut state employee pay raise and labor improvements in senate budget
- Senate voted against abortion rights bills
- Senate voted against landfill protection bill
- Senate received non-partisan cannabis bill from House
 - liquor commission in charge
 - license commercial retail shops
 - medical dispensaries could be dual-licensed
 - current bill predicts \$2B whole ale receipts
 - 30% to paydown pension deficit
 - 10% prevention + mental health
 - 50% to reduce SWEPT
 - o 12.5% wholesale tax

House Report

Rep. Laura Telerski

- Great win with bi-partisan budget
- Eliminated most licensure restrictions from Gov budget
- Enhancements from Gov budget:
 - increased medicare rates by \$30M
 - Pension improvements
- Floor amendment wins:
 - Eliminated \$1.4M for Northern Border Alliance
 - Elimination unannounced border checkpoints
- Accelerated phase out of Interest & Dividend tax remains in budg

City Updates

Char Derek Thibeaut, Alderman Ward 8

- Excitement over Nashua Center for the Arts opening
- Asphalt Plant application from Newport Construction off Temple St commentary by Rep. Mike Pederson
 - Traffic is a concern and corresponding diesel pollution
 - Company owns another Asphalt plant in Westford, was fought for 10 years in court, not near any residential communities
 - o Represented by Prolman, with numerous experts

- Strong testimony from HS Students to Planning Board
- 2 Public hearings to date, next meeting planned for May
- Mohawk Tannery Status
 - Initial bills passed to start approval process
 - City-wide event to notify public and answer questions
 - Presentation available on YouTube
 - Ward 4 concern: solution is environmental solution is not permanent
 - Little public participation in public hearings, getting public participation is difficult
